
First Reading 1 Peter 2:9-12




⁷Then a cloud appeared and covered them, and a voice came from the cloud: "This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to him!"

Lenten Bible Reading Plan

We will be offering a 40-day Bible reading plan during the season of Lent for you to follow along with if you so choose. We also have a Facebook group available, which will have daily reading reminders and provide a forum for people to post their insights or ask questions about the day's reading with others who are participating. Ash Wednesday Service

Join your church family at 7pm on Wednesday for a special remembrance of Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday begins the 40 days of Lent, the season during which the Church remembers the passion and death of Jesus. During these 40 days, Christians reflect on their lives and repent of the sin that sent the Savior to the cross.

Worship that evening will include the imposition of ashes, a solemn symbol with deep roots and wide precedent in both the Old and New Testaments. Ashes symbolize human mortality and the deserved destruction of all who sin. Like Job, believers of many ages repent in "dust and ashes." The symbol emphasizes the seriousness of sin. The practice of imposing ashes on Ash Wednesday is experiencing renewed appreciation among some WELS congregations. With this in mind, the service provides worshipers an opportunity to experience this custom. Receiving ashes is not mandatory.

Ash Wednesday Meal

Prior to worship on Ash Wednesday, a few of our teens will be hosting a dinner for anyone interested. They plan to attend the 2024 WELS International Youth Rally in Fort Collins, Colorado, this summer and will be using this as an opportunity to help raise funds to defray the costs of attending. They will make meals, serve food, bus the tables, and clean up after the event. There will be a tip jar available if you are able to help support these young Christians in their efforts. They will also have desserts available for purchase.

As they are doing the majority of planning for this dinner, they would sincerely appreciate it if you could let them know in advance if you will be coming. There is a sign-up sheet in the entryway of the church, or you can sign up by scanning the QR code below. This will give them an idea of how many people to expect.
